Looking for a place to anchor. Unfortunately, in this area the coast drops steep into the see, leaving no room for sandy beaches. I tried to park reverse to a rock formation, which took a lot of work (bringing out the landline with the SUP) and was a little scary.

So finally ended up at a buoy at <u>Rava island</u>. Beeing a little tired, I nearly messed up the mooring by confusing the forward / revers gears. A small village with a nice pub, Konoba Dellicia.

7h sailing, 23 nm Wind 8-15 kn, SE





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


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
